Description of the course

This course is suitable for the student with no prior knowledge of Latin and aims to provide him/her with a thorough grounding in the language. (Students with high school Latin should consider Latin 111b, a beginners' reading course.)

Class time will be given over to covering the grammar topics presented in *Latin: An Intensive Course*. Regular and prompt attendance in class is required. More than four absences from class or labs without Dean's excuses will result in failure or dismissal from the course.

There will be regular assignments, which you must complete independently. You should expect to spend a considerable time outside class completing these assignments and consolidating material presented in class. There will also be quizzes most Mondays, two midterm exams and a cumulative final exam.
